ABOUT THIS REPORT

The Workforce Intelligence Network for Southeast Michigan (WIN) is a workforce collaborative comprised of seven Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) and ten community colleges in a 19-county region representing approximately 63% of the total labor force in Michigan. The counties in the WIN partnership include Clinton, Eaton, Genesee, Hillsdale, Huron, Ingham, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw, and Wayne.

The WIN data and research team analyzes job posting data at the occupation level within eleven customized occupation groups built using specific **Standard Occupational Classification (SOC)** codes to provide more contextualized information. Occupation groups combine data for jobs with similar skillsets, educational attainment, and experience requirements, which provides a more in-depth snapshot of the current labor market when compared to traditional industry data based upon **North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)** codes. Occupation outlook sections utilize these metrics to identify and display the top in-demand jobs, entry-level requirements, and earning potential.

WIN produces a **quarterly 19-county WIN region report** using data from all eleven occupation groups. A **City of Detroit report** is also produced quarterly, focusing on five occupation groups related to the Detroit labor market. **County reports** are produced annually and focus on five occupation groups chosen to reflect the labor market specific to the county.

This report highlights labor market information and real-time job posting data for Oakland County, including a workforce overview that identifies key components of the area's labor market such as labor force status, demographic, and commuting data. WIN's analysis of online job postings, a proxy for employer demand, is a pioneering method for tracking the labor market's health. The data is used to provide real-time demand and job posting information for both employers and job seekers. This report analyzes the 2024 labor market information from Oakland County for the Business and Finance, Health Care, Information Technology, Skilled Trades, and TDL occupation groups.

OAKLAND COUNTY

Annual State of the Labor Market

The uncertainty that the coronavirus pandemic once brought to labor markets all but dissipated in 2023. Over the course of CY2024, the labor force grew by 7,266 individuals (1.1 percent) while employment increased by 2,628 individuals (0.4 percent) from 2023. Unemployment increased by 4,638 workers and the unemployment rate increased by 0.6 percentage points from 2.9 percent in 2023 to 3.5 percent in 2024. Registered Nurses tops the list as the most demanded occupation in 2024, accounting for 8,657 job postings followed by Retail Salespersons with 7,077 postings. The Health Care and Business and Finance occupation groups continue to be heavily demanded in Oakland County.

Annual Labor Market Information

The labor force in Oakland County grew in 2024, increasing by 7,266 individuals (1.1 percent) from the prior year. Employment increased by 2,628 workers (0.4 percent) over the same period, while unemployment increased by 4,638 workers (23.5 percent) for a total of 24,341 unemployed workers in 2024. The unemployment rate increased in 2024 to 3.5 percent, an increase of 0.2 percentage points since the 5.4 percent drop in 2021, following the large spike in 2020 at 8.7 percent.

Quarterly Employer Demand Overview

The fourth quarter of 2024 shows that employer demand has decreased since Q3 2024. In Q4 2024, there were 34,146 unique average postings per month in Oakland County. This marked a decrease of 2,619 postings from the 36,764 monthly average postings recorded in Q3. The first quarter had the highest recorded average monthly postings in 2024 with 39,297, an increase of 7,487 postings (23.5 percent) since Q4 2023.


During 2024, there were 198,649 job postings, 20,627 fewer than the 219,276 postings made during 2023 in Oakland County. The first guarter of 2024 saw the highest demand for the year with 39,297 postings, a 23.5 percent increase since 04 2023. The top posted job occupations in 2024 include Registered Nurses. Retail Salespersons, First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers, Customer Service Representatives, and Home Health and Personal Care Aides. Of the 198,649 unique postings in Oakland County during 2024, 51,507 (25.9 percent) required a High School diploma or equivalent, while 65,714 postings (32.8 percent) required an Associate or Bachelor's degree. An additional 16,524 postings (8.3 percent) required an advanced degree. The high demand for Health Care and Business and Finance jobs, within the county, drives this demand for workers with various skill sets.

The quarterly labor market shifts that were observed during the height of the coronavirus pandemic have further stabilized in 2024. Labor Force and Employment numbers rose past pre-pandemic numbers for the first time since 2019 while the unemployment rate also saw its highest rate since the pandemic. The labor force numbers peaked in Q3 with a high of 691,758 individuals and employment numbers peaked in Q1 2024 with 668,010 workers. Total unemployment and the unemployment rate are starting to see an increase again post pandemic, increasing to 24,341 workers and a corresponding rate of 3.5 percent in 2024. The market experienced mild volatility in unemployment and the unemployment rate through Q4 2024. The unemployment rate at the end of Q4 2023 was 3.8 percent. LABOR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT, AND UNEMPLOYMENT

Following labor force fluctuations throughout 2024, labor force participation totaled 686,260 individuals, a increase of 7,266 individuals since 2023. Employment is up to 661,919 workers in 2024, an increase of 2,628 workers. Both unemployment and the unemployment rate increased. Unemployment increased to 24,341 workers, up by 4,638 workers since 2023, and a significant improvement from the high of 56,237 workers recorded in 2020. Similarly, the unemployment rate increased by 0.6 percentage points for a 2024 unemployment rate of 3.5 percent.

CENSUS 2023 LABOR FORCE DEMOGRAPHICS

During 2023, the most recent census year, there were about 693,475 individuals in the labor force, meaning that these individuals were either working or seeking employment, in Oakland County. Slightly more than half of the population, 660,483 individuals (51.9 percent) living in the county were actively working. The highest unemployment rates were seen in those age 24 years old or younger. Males under the age of 25 face an unemployment rate of 21.3 percent, compared to females under the age of 25 reporting an unemployment rate of 21.0 percent.


2023 Census Population

According to data from the most recent Census Bureau 2023 ACS Five-Year estimates, the population in Oakland County decreased by just 30 individuals between 2022 and 2023. During 2023, there were 1,272,294 people were living in the county. The gender of the populace was split almost evenly, with about 50.6 percent of the population identifying as female and the other 49.4 percent identifying as male. A majority of the population identified as White (70.6 percent) with the second largest number of individuals identifying as Black or African American (13.0 percent). The region is facing an aging populace; with 32.1 percent of the population over the age of 54, compared to 28.4 percent under the age of 25.


2024 Current Workforce

In 2024, the workforce had a total of 747,604 individuals working in Oakland County. A slight majority, 50.7 percent (378,786 workers) were male, while 49.3 percent (368,818 workers) of the workforce was female. Most workers in the county identified as White, accounting for 73.0 percent of the workforce, while Black or African American workers totaled 14.9 percent of the workforce. Those identifying as Asian ethnicity accounted for 5.3 percent. A significant concentration of the workforce in Oakland County are between the age of 25 and 54 (63.3 percent), while 23.4 percent of workers are 55 and older.


Population Gender Demographics




Workforce Gender Demographics

Workforce Race and Ethnicity Demographics



Workforce Age Demographics





2024 REGIONAL COMMUTING PATTERNS


OAKLAND COUNTY

According to the most recent OnTheMap data set available from the Census Bureau, during 2022, Oakland County's workforce consisted of 535,902 residents. There were 298,465 (55.7 percent) residents living and working within the County, while the remaining 237,437 residents (44.3 percent) traveled outside of the County for work. There were 688,012 workers employed in the County during 2022. Of those, 389,547 workers (56.6 percent) lived outside of the County's borders and commuted in for work. Based upon this information, it can be concluded that Oakland is a net importer of jobs, with more workers commuting into the area for employment than leaving.






Registered Nurses is the top posted occupation for 2024 with 8,657 unique online job postings, and requires a Bachelor's degree for entry. Retail Salespersons (7,077 postings) and First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers (4,075 postings) round out the top three demanded occupations, with the former requiring no formal educational credential and First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workersrequiring a High School Diploma, respectively. Among the top 10 in-demand jobs, only two require a Bachelor's degree.

Top Posted Entry-Level Jobs


Entry-level jobs, which usually require zero to two years of previous experience, account for 25.1 percent of postings in Oakland County. Half of the top ten entry-level occupations require a High school diploma or equivalent. Those who enter the workforce with a High School diploma or equivalent are heavily demanded among entry-level occupations, accounting for 35.1 percent of entry-level postings. Registered Nurses were the top posted entry-level occupation with 4,180 postings, followed by First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers with 1,514 postings.

BUSINESS AND FINANCE OCCUPATION GROUP


Jobs in the Business and Finance occupation group can be found in nearly every type of establishment/firm throughout the region. These workers need strong mathematical and accounting abilities along with project management and planning skills. Workers in this occupation group are in high demand in southeast Michigan, with about 21,000 job openings annually.



Business and Finance Worker Demographics

The Business and Finance occupation group is somewhat diverse in respect to its 105,139 workers. This group is primarily made up of males (51.9 percent) and between the ages of 25 and 54 (70.7 percent), with 48.1 percent of workers identifying as female and just 19.3 percent identifying as a racial minority. Also of note was that 4.6 percent of the workers in the occupation group were under the age of 25, compared to the 24.8 percent 55 years of age or older.



In 2024, there were a total of 28,015 job postings for Business and Finance workers, with Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products as the most sought-after occupation by Business and Finance industry employers during 2024, with 3,230 postings. General and Operations Managers was in the second position with 2,366 postings. Other top posted jobs include Financial Managers (1,876 postings), Project Management Specialists (1,823 postings), and Sales Managers (1,528 postings).

Wage Overview

Most Business and Finance related jobs offer high wages, providing a lucrative opportunity for job seekers willing to attain the necessary education. The Business and Finance occupation group offers a relatively broad array of entry requirements, though a majority of jobs require a Bachelor's degree. Half of the top jobs pay over \$49.00 per hour. Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products, the top posted Business and Finance job, offers a median hourly wage of \$39.40 per hour or an annual salary of about \$81,952.



HEALTH CARE OCCUPATION GROUP


WIN's Health Care occupation group includes jobs related to Health Care support and practitioners. Employment in this group has been consistently growing, with more Health Care workers needed to care for Michigan's aging population. Registered Nurses are routinely the most in-demand job in this group. Annually, there are about 23,600 job openings for these positions across southeast Michigan, and this is projected to continue increasing.

According to 2024 Lightcast data, the 83,218 workers in the Health Care group are not particularly diverse. Just 9.9 percent of the related workforce is under 25. Male workers account for 19.2 percent of the current workforce and only 33.6 percent identify as a race other than White. As the labor force overall continues to change, this field would benefit from seeking a more diverse talent pool.



Top Posted Jobs

In 2024, there were a total of 32,495 job postings for Health Care workers, with Registered Nurses as the most sought-after occupation by Health Care industry employers during 2024, with 8,657 postings. Home Health and Personal Care Aides was in the second position with 3,417 postings. Other top posted jobs include Medical Assistants (2,011 postings), Health Technologists and Technicians, All Other (1,495 postings), and Pharmacy Technicians (1,283 postings). Top occupations in Health Care are available at many education levels, and employment for some roles, such as Home Health and Personal Care Aides, and Pharmacy Technicians, only require a High School diploma or equivalent, coupled with short to moderate-term on-the-job training.

Wage Overview

Wages in the Health Care field tend to scale with both education and experience. The Health Care occupation group offers a relatively broad array of entry requirements and a high volume of jobs are open to candidates with an Associate or Bachelor's degree. At least half of the top jobs pay over \$20.00 per hour. Registered Nurses, the top posted Health Care job, offers a median hourly wage of \$41.02 per hour or an annual salary of about \$85,322.




Information Technology (IT) jobs include occupations that are associated with entry-level, technical, and professional careers related to the design, development, support and management of hardware, software, multimedia, and systems integration services. While the Information Technology group does not currently employ as many individuals as the other groups here, it is quickly growing, and about 7,000 job openings are reported in the region annually.



Information Technology Worker Demographics



Race and Ethnicity Demographics







Race and Ethnicity Demographics








