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INTRODUCTION

ABOUT THIS REPORT

The Workforce Intelligence Network for Southeast Michigan (WIN) is a workforce collaborative comprised of seven Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) and ten community colleges in a 19-county region representing approximately 63% of the total labor force in Michigan. The counties in the WIN partnership include Clinton, Eaton, Genesee, Hillsdale, Huron, Ingham, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw, and Wayne.

The WIN data and research team analyzes job posting data at the occupation level within eleven customized occupation groups built using specific Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes to provide more contextualized information. Occupation groups combine data for jobs with similar skillsets, educational attainment, and experience requirements, which provides a more in-depth snapshot of the current labor market when compared to traditional industry data based upon North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. Occupation outlook sections utilize these metrics to identify and display the top in-demand jobs, entry-level requirements, and earning potential.

WIN produces a quarterly 19-county WIN region report using data from all eleven occupation groups. A city of Detroit report is also produced quarterly, focusing on five occupation groups related to the Detroit labor market. County reports are produced annually and focus on five occupation groups chosen to reflect the labor market specific to the county.

This report highlights labor market information and real-time job posting data for Wayne County, including a workforce overview that identifies key components of the area's labor market such as labor force status, demographic, and commuting data. WIN's analysis of online job postings, a proxy for employer demand, is a pioneering method for tracking the labor market's health. The data is used to provide real-time demand and job posting information for both employers and job seekers. This report analyzes the 2024 labor market information from Wayne County for the Energy, Engineering and Design, Health Care, Information Technology (IT), and Skilled Trades occupation groups.


Annual State of the Labor Market

Over the course of CY2024, the labor force increased by 9,699 individuals (1.2 percent) while employment decreased by 503 individuals (0.1 percent) compared to 2023. Unemployment grew up by 10,202 workers and the unemployment rate increased 1.2 percentage points from 4.3 percent in 2023 to 5.5 percent in 2024. Registered Nurses tops the list as the most demanded occupation in 2024, accounting for 12,626 job postings, followed closely by Retail Salespersons with 5,061 postings. The Health Care and Information Technology occupation groups remain in heavy demand in Wayne County.

Annual Labor Market Information

The labor force in Wayne County increased in 2024, adding 9,699 individuals (1.2 percent) from the prior year. Employment decreased by 503 workers (0.1 percent) over the same period, while unemployment increased by 10,202 workers (29.3 percent) for a total of 45,020 unemployed workers in 2024. The unemployment rate increased in 2024 to 5.5 percent, a fall of 7.5 percentage points since the 13.0 percent spike in 2020. The unemployment rate has recovered to pre-pandemic levels, with an unemployment rate of 5.5 percent in 2024 for Wayne County.

Quarterly Employer Demand Overview

The fourth quarter of 2024 continued a trend of declining job postings, illustrating that employer demand has decreased in each of the past four quarters. In Q4 2024, there was a monthly average of 37,609 unique postings per month in Wayne County, a decrease of 2,993 monthly postings from the 40,603 monthly average recorded in Q3. The first quarter had the highest recorded postings in 2024 with 45,331 average monthly postings, an increase of 8.175 postings (22.0 percent) since Q4 2023. But, the employer demand gradually declined throughout 2024.



During 2024, there were 224,759 job postings, 29,995 less than the 254,754 postings made during 2023 in Wayne County. The first quarter saw the highest demand for the year with 45,331 average monthly postings, a 22.0 percent increase since Q4 2023. The top posted job occupations in 2024 include Registered Nurses, Retail Salespersons, Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, Software Developers, Computer Occupations, All Other. Of the 224,759 unique postings in Wayne County during 2024, 54,454 (24.2 percent) required a High School diploma or equivalent, while 87,969 postings (39.1 percent) required a college degree. An additional 24,291 postings (10.8 percent) required an advanced degree. The high demand for Health Care and Energy jobs within the County drives this demand for workers with various skill sets.





The quarterly labor market showed signs of softening throughout 2024. After a slight decline from Q1 to Q2, the labor force dropped in the second half of the year, falling from 823,682 in Q3 to 807,692 in Q4. Employment followed a similar pattern, with a notable decline between Q3 and Q4. Unemployment peaked at 50,893 workers in Q3 before declining slightly to 48,875 in Q4. Despite some quarter-to-quarter fluctuations, unemployment was significantly higher compared to 2023. The unemployment rate rose steadily during the year, reaching 6.1 percent by Q4 2024. LABOR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT, AND UNEMPLOYMENT

Following labor force fluctuations throughout 2024, labor force participation totaled 816,236 individuals, an increase of 9,699 individuals since 2023. Employment declined to 771,216 workers, a decrease of 503 workers. Both unemployment and the unemployment rate rose, reflecting ongoing economic uncertainty. Unemployment increased to 45,020 workers, up by 10,202 since 2023 but still well below the peak of 102,715 recorded in 2020. Similarly, the unemployment rate rose by 1.2 percentage points for a 2024 unemployment rate of 5.5 percent.

CENSUS 2023 LABOR FORCE DEMOGRAPHICS

During 2023, the most recent census year, there were about 830,901 people in the labor force, meaning that these individuals were either working or seeking employment in Wayne County. Resident employment in the region totals 758,808 workers or under half, 42.8 percent, of the total population in Wayne County. The highest unemployment rates in 2023 were those individuals age 24 years old or younger, accounting for an unemployment rate of 39.1 percent for males and 32.7 percent for females. Overall, males in the county have a higher unemployment rate than females, with 8.9 percent and 8.5 percent respectively, for 2023. Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander job seekers have a difficult time finding employment, facing an unemployment rate of 20.2 percent. Those job seekers who identify as Black or African American also face difficulty, with an unemployment rate of 13.6 percent.


2023 Census Population

According to data from the most recent Census Bureau 2023 ACS Five-Year estimates, the population in Wayne County decreased by about 0.4 percent between 2022 and 2023. During 2023, there were 1,773,767 people living in the county. The gender of the populace was split evenly, with about 51.6 percent of the population identifying as female and the other 48.4 percent identifying as male. A slight majority of the population identified as White (50.0 percent) with the second largest number of individuals identifying as Black or African American (37.2 percent). The region is facing an aging populace; with 29.1 percent of the population over the age of 54, compared to 32.1 percent under the age of 25.


2024 Current Workforce

In 2024, the workforce had a total of 743,986 individuals working in Wayne County. A slight majority, 51.9 percent (385,910 workers) were male, while 48.1 percent (358,076 workers) of the workforce was female. Most workers in the county identified as White, accounting for 66.3 percent of the workforce, while Black or African American workers totaled 21.6 percent of the workforce. Those identifying as Hispanic or Latino ethnicity accounted for 5.2 percent. A significant concentration of the workforce in Wayne County is between the age of 25 and 54 (63.9 percent), while 23.4 percent of workers are 55 and older.


Population Gender Demographics




Workforce Gender Demographics




According to the most recent OnTheMap data set available from the Census Bureau, during 2021, the county's workforce consisted of 627,723 residents. There were 345,056 (55.0 percent) residents living and working within the County, while the remaining 282,667 residents (45.0 percent) traveled outside of the County for work. There were 634,757 workers employed in the county during 2021. Of those, 289,701 workers (45.6 percent) lived outside of the County borders and commuted in for work. Based upon this information, it can be

concluded that Wayne County is a net importer of jobs, with more workers commuting into the area for





Top Posted Jobs

Registered Nurses is the top posted occupation for 2024 with 12,626 unique online job postings, and requires a Bachelor's degree for entry. Retail Salespersons (5,061 postings) and Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers (4,920 postings) round out the top three demanded occupations, requiring a No formal education credential and Postsecondary nondegree award, respectively. Among the top 10 in-demand jobs, less than half require a Bachelor's degree.


Entry-level jobs, which usually require zero to two years of previous experience, account for 24.7 percent of postings in Wayne County. Half of the top ten entry-level occupations require a High School diploma or equivalent. Those who enter the workforce with a High School diploma or equivalent are heavily demanded among entry-level occupations, accounting for 33.2 percent of entry-level postings. Registered Nurses was the top posted entry-level occupation with 5,045 postings, followed by Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers with 1,870 postings.

ENERGY OCCUPATION GROUP


Energy-related occupations encompass jobs in engineering, science, mining, and extraction. Workers in this field have a range of skills all related to keeping businesses and homes powered. Energy companies employ workers in a variety of occupations, many of which are also included in other WIN occupation groups. Posting data referenced in this section pertain only to job postings from energy-related businesses, while employment and wage data apply for these workers in every industry.



Energy Worker Demographics

In 2024, there were 61,318 workers in the Energy occupation group. This group is primarily made up of males (83.3 percent) between the age of 25 and 54 (69.8 percent), with 16.7 percent of workers identifying as female and just 26.3 percent identifying as a racial minority. Also of note was that 5.5 percent of the workers in the occupation group were under the age of 25, compared to the 24.8 percent 55 years of age or older.






Jobs in the manufacturing industry can range from assembly and production, skilled trades and technicians, designers and engineers, and even computer-related occupations such as software development. Demand for engineers in the region has been consistent, and employment has been growing quickly. There are about 8,500 openings annually for engineers in southeast Michigan.




WIN's Health Care occupation group includes jobs related to health care support and practitioners. Employment in this group has been consistently growing, with more Health Care workers needed to care for Michigan's aging population. Registered Nurses are routinely the most in-demand job in this group. Annually, there are about 23,600 job openings for these positions across southeast Michigan, and this is projected to continue increasing.


Worker Age Demographics












