INTRODUCTION

About This Report

The Workforce Intelligence Network for Southeast Michigan (WIN) partnership is a collaboration of Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) and community colleges across a 19-county region in Michigan. The counties in the WIN partnership include Clinton, Eaton, Genesee, Hillsdale, Huron, Ingham, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw, and Wayne, along with the City of Detroit.

The WIN data and research team analyzes job posting data at the occupation level within eleven customized occupation groups built using specific Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes to provide more contextualized information. Occupation groups combine data for jobs with similar skillsets, educational attainment, and experience requirements, which provides a more in-depth snapshot of the current labor market when compared to traditional industry data based upon North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. Occupation outlook sections utilize these metrics to identify and display the top in-demand jobs, entry-level requirements, and earning potential.

WIN produces a quarterly 19-county region report using data from all eleven occupation groups. A report focused on the city of Detroit is also produced quarterly, focusing on five occupation groups related to the Detroit labor market. County reports are produced annually and focus on five occupation groups chosen to reflect the labor market specific to the county.

This report highlights labor market information and real-time job posting data for Oakland County, including a workforce overview that identifies key components of the area's labor market such as labor force status, demographic, and commuting data. WIN's analysis of online job postings, a proxy for employer demand, is a pioneering method for tracking the labor market's health. The data is used to provide real-time demand and job posting information for both employers and job seekers. This report analyzes the 2022 labor market information from Oakland County for the Business and Finance, Healthcare, Information Technology (IT), Skilled Trades, and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics (TDL) occupation groups.

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ANNUAL STATE OF THE LABOR MARKET

State of the Labor Market in Oakland County

The slowdown of the COVID-19 crisis continued to cause shifts in the labor market this year. In 2022, the labor force grew by 23,735 individuals (3.7 percent) while employment increased by 24,935 individuals (4.0 percent) from 2021. Unemployment went down by 20,242 workers and the unemployment rate tapered off, decreasing 0.3 percentage points from 3.3 percent in 2021 to 3.0 percent in 2022. Quarterly posting data shows shifts in hiring and skills demanded as the region continues its recovery. Registered Nurses tops the list as the most demanded occupation in 2022, accounting for 44,891 job postings followed by Retail Salespersons with 33,200 postings. The customer service and information technology occupation groups continue to be heavily demanded in Oakland County.

Annual Labor Market Information

The labor force in Oakland County grew in 2022, increasing by 23,735 individuals (3.7 percent) from the prior year. Employment increased by 24,935 workers (4.0 percent) over the same period, while unemployment decreased by 1,199 workers (5.6 percent) for a total of 21,242 unemployed workers in 2022. The unemployment rate decreased in 2022 to 3.0 percent, a fall of 0.3 percentage points since the 3.3 percent drop in 2021, following the large spike in 2020 at 8.7%. The unemployment rate has recovered to prepandemic levels, with an unemployment rate of 3.0 percent in 2022 in Oakland county since government shutdown measures for the pandemic relaxed in 2021.

Quarterly Employer Demand Overview

The fourth quarter of 2022 shows that employer demand has slightly decreased since 2022. In Q4 2022, there were a monthly average of 59,453 postings in Oakland County. This marked a notable decrease of 4,780 postings from the monthly average of 64,215 recorded in Q3. The second quarter had the highest recorded postings in 2022 66,925, with increase of 2,634 postings since Q1 2022. The decreases percent) from Q2 to Q4 might signal that post Covid-19 economic recovery has peaked.


During 2022, there were 286,784 job postings, 16,318 more than the 270,466 postings made during 2021 in Oakland County. The second quarter of 2022 saw the highest demand for the year with 66,925 postings, a 4.1 percent increase since Q1 2022. The top posted job occupations in 2022 include Registered Nurses, Retail Salespersons, Software Developers, Sales Representatives Wholesale and Manufacturing and Customer Service Representatives. Of the 286,784 unique postings in Oakland County during 2022, 75,413 (26.3 percent) required a high school diploma or equivalent, while 107,341 postings (37.4 percent) required a college degree. An additional 29,461 postings (10.3 percent) required an advanced degree. The high demand for healthcare, customer service and information technology jobs, within the county, drives this demand for workers with various skill sets.

The pandemic-driven, quarterly labor market shifts that were seen in 2021 have persisted throughout 2022. The first quarter of 2022 saw an initial increase in the labor force and employment while the unemployment rate was at its peak with 3.7 percentage points. The labor force and employment numbers peaked in Q3 with a high of 670,890 individuals and 653,880 workers respectively, and unemployment decreased to 17,010 workers. The market continued to realign toward pre-pandemic levels, showing a decrease in unemployment and the unemployment rate through Q4 2022. The unemployment rate at the end of Q4 2022 was 2.4 percent. LABOR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT, AND UNEMPLOYMENT

Following labor force fluctuations throughout 2022, labor force participation totaled 667,120 individuals, a increase of 23,735 individuals since 2021. Employment is up to 646,878 workers in 2022, an increase of 24,935 workers. Both unemployment and the unemployment rate decreased, corresponding with the economic recovery. Unemployment decreased to 20,242workers, down by 1,199 workers since the high of 56,237 workers recorded in 2020. Similarly, the unemployment rate declined by 0.3percentage points for a 2022 unemployment rate of 3.0 percent.

CENSUS 2021 LABOR FORCE DEMOGRAPHICS

During 2021, the most recent census year, there were about 690,080 individuals in the labor force, meaning they were either working or looking for work, in Oakland County. Slightly more than half of the population, 656,612 individuals (51.6 percent) living in the county were actively working. The highest unemployment rates were seen in those aged 24 years old or younger. Males under the age of 25 face an unemployment rate of 23.3 percent, compared to females under the age of 25 reporting an unemployment rate of 21.1 percent.

POPULATION DEMOGRAPHICS


2021 Census Population

According to data from the most recent Census Bureau 2021 ACS Five-Year estimates, the population in Oakland County increased by about 1.3 percent between 2020 and 2021. During 2021, there were 1,271,983 people were living in the county. The sex of the populace was split almost evenly, with about 50.7 percent of the population identifying as female and the other 49.3 percent identifying as male. A majority of the population identified as White (72.9 percent) with the second largest number of individuals identifying as Black or African American (13.2 percent). The region is facing an aging populace; with 31.1 percent of the population over the age of 54, compared to 29.1 percent under the age of 25.


2022 Current Workforce

In 2022, the workforce had a total of 720,814 individuals working in Oakland County. A slight majority, 51.2 percent (368,881 workers) were male, while 48.8 percent (351,448 workers) of the workforce was female. Most workers in the county identified as White, accounting for 73.2 percent of the workforce, while Black or African American workers totaled 14.8 percent of the workforce. Those identifying as Asian ethnicity accounted for 5.5 percent. Much of the workforce in Oakland County are between the ages of 25 through 54 (63.9 percent), while 23.4 percent of workers are 55 and older.

Population Race Demographics




Workforce Race and Ethnicity Demographics

Workforce Age Demographics




REGIONAL COMMUTING PATTERNS

According to the most recent OnTheMap data set available from the Census Bureau, during 2020, Oakland County's workforce consisted of 523,328 residents. There were 295,638 (56.5 percent) residents living and working within the county, while the remaining 227,690 residents (43.5 percent) traveled outside of the county for work. There were 679,994 workers employed in the county during 2020. Of those, 384,356 workers (56.5 percent) lived outside of the county's borders and commuted in. From this information, we can see that Oakland is a net importer of jobs, with more workers entering the area for employment than outwardly commuting.


Registered Nurses is the top posted occupation for 2022 with 12,936 unique online job postings, and requires a Bachelor's degree for entry. Retail Salespersons (9,887 postings) and Software Developers (8,287 postings) round out the top three demanded occupations, requiring no formal educational credential and a Bachelor's degree, respectively. Most of the other in-demand jobs require no formal education or a high school diploma or equivalent, coupled with short-term on-the-job training.

Top Posted Entry-Level Jobs: 2022


Entry-level jobs, which usually require zero to two years of previous experience, account for 27.6 percent of postings in Oakland County. Over half of the top ten entry-level occupations require no formal education or a high school diploma or equivalent. Those who enter the workforce with a high school diploma or equivalent are heavily demanded among entry-level occupations, accounting for 36.4 percent of entry-level postings. Registered Nurses was the top posted entry-level occupation with 6,967 postings, followed by First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers with 2,377 postings.


BUSINESS AND FINANCE OCCUPATION GROUP

Jobs in the business and finance occupation group can be found in nearly every type of establishment/firm throughout the region. These workers need strong mathematical and accounting abilities along with project management and planning skills. Workers in this occupation group are in high demand in southeast Michigan, with about 21,000 job openings annually.



Business and Finance Worker Demographics


The business and finance occupation group is somewhat diverse in respect to its 105,620 workers. More than half the working population identify as male (52.3 percent), however, 80.3 percent of workers identified as white, indicating much less diversity with respect to race than gender. Only 4.5 percent of the working population in business and finance is under the age of 25, compared to 24.5 percent who are age 55 and older. In some ways, this indicates an aging business and finance workforce, though it also reflects the consistent need for a bachelor's degree in these occupations.

Top Posted Jobs

There were 47,476 business and finance postings during 2022. Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products is the top in-demand occupation with 7,235 postings. Managers, All Other (4,667 postings) is the second-highest demanded, while Human Resources Specialists (3,410 postings), General and Operations Managers (2,643 postings), and Accountants and Auditors (2,348 postings) round out the top demanded occupations.

Wage Overview

Most business and finance related jobs offer high wages, providing a lucrative opportunity for job seekers willing to attain the necessary education. The top posted business and finance job, Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products, offers a median hourly wage of \$33.09, translating to annual earnings of approximately \$68,827. All the top business occupations offer median wages over \$35.00 per hour, and most prefer a bachelor's degree for entry.



HEALTHCARE OCCUPATION GROUP


WIN's Healthcare occupation group includes jobs related to Healthcare support and practitioners. Employment in this group has been consistently growing, with more Healthcare workers needed to care for Michigan's aging population. Registered nurses are routinely the most in-demand job in this group. Annually, there are about 23,600 job openings for these positions across southeast Michigan, and this is projected to continue increasing.

According to 2022 Lightcast data, the Healthcare occupation group employed 77,950 workers in Oakland County, who are overwhelmingly female (80.8 percent) and between the ages of 25 and 54 (67.2 percent), although 23.1 percent of workers are over 54. The healthcare occupation group is primarily white in Oakland County, with 66.8 percent of workers identifying as white, 21.7 percent identifying as Black or African American, and 11.5 percent identifying otherwise.



Registered Nurses was the highest in-demand Healthcare occupation throughout 2022, with 12,936 postings. Other top posted jobs include Home Health and Personal Care Aides (4,299 postings), Nursing Assistants (2,733 postings), Medical Assistants (2,539 postings), and Health Technologists and Technicians, All Other (2,132 postings). Top occupations in Healthcare are available at many education levels, and employment for some roles, such as Home Health and Personal Care Aides and Pharmacy Technicians (1,226 postings), only require a high school diploma or equivalent, coupled with short to moderate-term on-the-job training.

HEALTHCARE OCCUPATION GROUP

Wage Overview

Wages in the high-demand Healthcare field tend to scale with both education and experience. The Healthcare occupation group offers a relatively broad array of entry requirements, and a high volume of jobs are open to candidates with less than a bachelor's degree. Most of the top-posted jobs pay over \$20.00 per hour. Registered Nurses, the top posted Healthcare job, offers a median hourly wage of \$37.86 per hour or an annual salary of about \$78,748.




INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OCCUPATION GROUP

Information technology (IT) jobs include occupations that are associated with entry-level, technical, and professional careers related to the design, development, support and management of hardware, software, multimedia, and systems integration services. While the information technology group does not currently employ as many individuals as the other groups here, it is quickly growing, and about 7,000 job openings are reported annually.



Information Technology Worker Demographics

According to 2022 Lightcast data, Oakland County has 33,056 IT workers. The workforce is not too diverse, with most workers identifying as male (73.2 percent) between the ages of 25 and 54 (78.8 percent). Workers aged 55 years and older account for 16.3 percent, while only 4.8 percent are 24 years old or younger. About 63.3 percent of the workforce identify as white, while workers who identify as Asian make up 23.1 percent of the workforce.

Race and Ethnicity Demographics


Worker Age Demographics

Top Posted Jobs

In 2022, there were 24,415 postings for IT workers in Oakland County. Software Developers were the most in-demand occupation with 8,287 postings, followed by Computer Occupations, All Other, with 4,944 postings. Computer User Support Specialists (2,900 postings), Computer Systems Analysts (1,783 postings), and Software Quality Assurance Analysts and Testers (1,082 postings) were also high in-demand occupations. Although the top IT jobs generally require a bachelor's degree, Computer User Support Specialists, typically require some college, no degree.

Other occupations that have fewer qualifications, such as Computer User Support Specialists and Computer Network Support Specialists, make over \$23.00 per hour.





Worker Gender Demographics








Worker Age Demographics
