About This Report

The Workforce Intelligence Network for Southeast Michigan (WIN) partnership is a collaboration of six Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) and ten community colleges across a 16-county region in Michigan. The counties in the WIN partnership include: Genesee, Hillsdale, Huron, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, Saint Clair, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw, and Wayne, along with the City of Detroit.

This report highlights labor market information and real-time job posting data for Oakland county. A workforce overview is provided within identifying key components of the area's labor market including labor force status, demographic, and commuting data. WIN's analysis of online job postings, a proxy for employer demand, is a pioneering method for tracking the health of the labor market. This data is used to provide a real-time demand overview, detailing posting related findings for both employers and job seekers. WIN's data and research team analyzes job posting data at the occupation level within eleven customized occupation groups built using specific Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes to provide more contextualized information. Occupation groups combine data for jobs with similar skillsets, educational attainment, and experience requirements, which provides a more indepth snapshot of the current labor market when compared to traditional industry data based upon North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. Occupation outlook sections utilize these metrics to identify and display the top in-demand jobs, their entry requirements, and their earning potential.

WIN produces a 16-county region report quarterly using data from all eleven occupation groups. A report focused on the city of Detroit is also produced quarterly, focusing on five occupation groups related to Detroit's labor market. County reports are produced annually and focus on five occupation groups chosen to reflect the labor market specific to the county.

This report analyzes data from the fourth quarter of 2018 in Oakland county and includes summative data for October, November, and December of 2018. The Oakland report focuses on analyzing the Business and Finance, Health Care, Information Technology, Skilled Trades, and TDL occupation groups.




State of the Labor Market in Oakland County

Over the course of 2018, the labor force and employment figures both increased in Oakland county. With this simultaneous increase in both labor force and employment, the number of unemployed individuals decreased in the region. This caused the unemployment rate to drop from the 3.4 percent annual rate in 2017 to the annual rate of 3.3 percent in 2018. Employer demand for most occupation groups also increased during Q4 2018. The TDL occupation group reported the highest demand with over 13,000 job postings during the quarter. Other occupation groups also offer great job opportunities for active job seekers: health care postings grew by 18 percent from Q3 2018, and 39 percent of postings were open to entry-level applicants.

Annual Labor Market Information


Moving into a ten-year high, the labor force in the Oakland county increased by 888 individuals between 2017 and 2018. Employment increased by nearly double that number between 2017 and 2018, adding 1,691 workers. With employment increasing by a greater margin than the labor force, the unemployment rate fell by percentage points from the already remarkably low annual figures in 2017 to an annual rate of 3.3 percent in 2018.

Quarterly Employer Demand Overview

Data from the fourth quarter of 2018, including posting information from October, November, and December, showed continued growth employer demand in Oakland County. There were 13,483 more postings during Q4 2018 than the 88,258 postings made during Q4 2017 for a total of 101,741 postings. Typically, demand tends to grow through the end of the year, and Q4 2018 job postings are 15 percent higher than the level of demand at the end of 2017.



Employer demand surges to 101,400 postings during Q4 2018, with most occupation groups analyzed by WIN experiencing increases in online job postings between Q3 and Q4 2018.

During Q4 2018, there were 101,437 jobs posted, 7,649 more than the 93,788 jobs posted during Q3 2018 in Oakland County. Most of the occupation groups analyzed by WIN experienced an increase during the fourth quarter of 2018. The IT and health care groups each increased by over 1,000 postings, while business and finance and TDL also grew by over 500 postings from Q3 2018. A bachelor's degree is required for many of the fastest-growing occupations. For more information about quarterly job postings, see page 2.

Postings by Occupation Group Q4 2018



Job postings made by employers in Oakland County indicate a high school diploma or GED as the most indemand minimum education level during Q4 2018.

Over a quarter (31.4 percent) of the 101,437 jobs posted in Oakland county indicated the need for candidates with a bachelor's degree. Another 21.5 percent of these postings were looking for applicants with a high school diploma or equivalent. Higher education attainment tends to lead to more lucrative opportunities, but many entry level opportunities exist in each occupation group. As only 68 percent of job postings identified a minimum education level, educational requirements may vary somewhat across all job openings in the county.


The Q4 2018 unemployment rate of 3.2 percent in Oakland County was down 0.2 percentage points from Q3 2018.

Employment has grown somewhat since Q3 2018, while the labor force has fallen slightly. The growth in workers combined with the drop in labor force participants caused the quarterly unemployment rate to drop from 3.4 percent in Q3 2018 to 3.2 percent in Q4 2018 as fewer people looked for work. Unemployment was low in the county during 2018, even reaching an unemployment rate below 3.0 percent in April and May. Labor Force, Employment, and Unemployment


The labor market in Oakland County has experienced relative stability since 2010. The labor force decreased by 234 workers (0.0 percent) between Q3 2018 and Q4 2018. Employment in the county increased from Q3 2018 values by 780 workers (0.1 percent). With employment increasing while the labor force decreased, the unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage points between Q3 2018 and Q4 2018 to 3.2 percent.

Population Demographics


According to the data from the most recent Census Bureau 2017 ACS Five Year estimates, the population in Oakland increased by 0.5 percent between 2016 and 2017. During 2017, 1,241,860 people were living in the region. The sex of the populace was split almost evenly, with about 51 percent of the population identifying as female, and the other 49 percent identifying as male. The majority of the population identified as white (76 percent) with the second largest number of individuals identifying as black or African American (14 percent). The region as a whole is facing an aging population; 30 percent of population was over the age of 55, compared to 18 percent under the age of 14.



Labor Market Demographics


During 2017, the most recent census year, there were about 665,000 people in the labor force, meaning they were either working or looking for work, in Oakland County. Slightly more than half of the population of 1,241,860 individuals (54 percent) living in the region were participating in the labor force. The highest unemployment rates were seen in those aged 24 years old or younger. Males under the age of 19 face an unemployment rate of 20.8 percent. Black or African American job seekers also have a difficult time finding employment, facing an unemployment rate of 9.2 percent.

Current Workforce Demographics


While the Census Bureau data is lagged by about two years, Emsi uses predictive modeling to estimate workforce information for the previous year, allowing for more current analysis. During 2018, there were a total of 747,710 individuals working in Oakland County. A slight majority (51 percent or 378,017 workers) were male, while 49 percent (369,694 workers) of the workforce was female. Most of those working in the region were white, accounting for 73.8 percent of the workforce, while African American or black workers accounted for 15.8 percent of the workforce. Those identifying as having a Hispanic or Latino ethnicity accounted for 3.8 percent. Eighty-six percent of the workforce was 25 years or older. Only fourteen percent of those under the age of 25 were working, indicating an aging workforce in Oakland County.

Workforce Age Demographics




Regional Commuting Patterns

According to the most recent OnTheMap data set available from the Census Bureau, during 2015, the county's workforce consisted of 547,430 residents. 312,652 (57.1 percent) of the residents lived and worked within the county, while the remaining 234,778 residents (42.9 percent) traveled outside of the region for work. There were 687,465 workers employed in the region during 2015. Of those, 374,816 workers (54.5 percent) lived outside of the region's borders and commuted in. From this information, we can see that the Oakland is a net importer of jobs, with more workers entering the area for employment than outwardly commuting.




Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers were the highest indemand occupation for the fourth quarter of 2018, with 5,139 online job postings. Of the top five overall in-demand occupations, only Software Developers, Applications typically requires a bachelor's degree for entry. Median wages for Software Developers are nearly \$25 more per hour than the other top jobs. Customer service occupations are also in high demand, with First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers (2,987 postings) and Retail Salespersons (3,531 postings) also featured in the top five. Several engineering roles are featured within the top 10 in Oakland county, and perennial top occupation Registered Nurses has fallen to the number 7 spot.






BUSINESS AND FINANCE OCCUPATION GROUP Oakland County | Q4 2018

Introduction

Jobs in the business and finance occupation group can be found in nearly every type of establishment/firm throughout the region. These workers need strong mathematical and accounting abilities along with project management and planning skills. Workers in this occupation group are in high demand in southeast Michigan.





Business and Finance Worker Demographics

According to the most recent Emsi data set available (2018), the business and finance occupation group is a relatively diverse occupation group with respect to its nearly 70,000 workers. Half the working population identify as female (50 percent). In addition, 81 percent of workers are white, so the field may offer opportunity for minority workers. Only five percent of the working population is under the age of 25, indicating a large aging population of business and finance workers.



Accountants and Auditors was the highest in-demand business and finance occupation during Q4 2018, with 1,309 postings. Marketing Managers were also in high demand with 1,007 postings. Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products (889 postings), **Business Operations** Specialists, All Other (867 postings), and Financial Managers (718 postings) were each in-demand business and finance occupations during Q4 2018.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), the top posted business and finance job, Accountants and Auditors offers median hourly wages of \$35.76, translating to annual earnings of approximately \$74,000.






Introduction

WIN's health care occupation group includes jobs related to health care support and practitioners. Employment in this group has been consistently growing, more health care workers needed to care for Michigan's aging population and in response to regulatory and other changes. Registered nurses are routinely the most in-demand job in this group.

Health Care Worker Demographics

According to the most recent Emsi data set available (2018), the Health Care occupation group employs around 70,000 workers, who are primarily female (80 percent) and between the ages of 25 and 54 (70 percent), although 21 percent of workers are over 55. The group has a similar proportion of racial minorities as the workforce as a whole, with 70 percent of workers identifying as white, 20 percent identifying as black or African American, and ten percent identifying otherwise.



Health Care Wage Overview

Wages in the high-demand health care field tend to scale with both education and experience. The health care occupation group offers a relatively broad array of entry requirements and a high volume of jobs are open to candidates with less than a bachelor's degree. These jobs that require less than a bachelor's degree pay more than the region's median wage of \$17.81 per hour. Registered Nurses, the top posted health care job in Q4 2018, offers a median hourly wage of \$35.22 per hour or annual salary of about \$73,000 according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS).







INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT) OCCUPATION GROUP Oakland County | Q4 2018

Introduction

Information technology (IT) jobs include occupations that are associated with entry-level, technical, and professional careers related to the design, development, support and management of hardware, software, multimedia, and systems integration services. While the information technology group does not currently employ as many individuals as the other groups here, it is quickly growing.









IT Worker Demographics

According to the most recent Emsi data set available (2018), the over 35,000 workers in the IT occupation group are primarily white males between the ages of twenty-five and fifty-four. Currently, 74 percent of workers identify as male, and 64 percent identify as white. There are a broad range of organizations providing specialized training resources for female and minority IT workers throughout southeast Michigan. With the push to diversify the IT field, more opportunities are opening for women and minorities.








Bachelors Degree Required for Most IT Jobs

IT Wage Overview

Most IT-related jobs offer high wages providing a lucrative opportunity to job seekers willing to meet the minimum education requirements related to these jobs. Software Developers, Applications, the top posted IT job in Q4 2018, offers a median hourly wage of \$43.86 per hour or about \$91,000 per year according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS).




Introduction








