INTRODUCTION

16-County WIN Region | Q2 2018

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About This Report

The Workforce Intelligence Network for Southeast Michigan (WIN) partnership is a collaboration of six Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) and ten community colleges across a 16-county region in Michigan. The counties in the WIN partnership include: Genesee, Hillsdale, Huron, Jackson, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, Saint Clair, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw, and Wayne, along with the City of Detroit.

This report highlights labor market information and real-time job posting data for the entire 16-county region of southeast Michigan. A workforce overview is provided within identifying key components of the area's labor market including labor force status, demographic, and commuting data. WIN's analysis of online job postings, a proxy for employer demand, is a pioneering method for tracking the health of the labor market. This data is used to provide a real-time demand overview, detailing posting related findings for both employers and job seekers. WIN's data and research team analyzes job posting data at the occupation level within eleven customized occupation groups built using specific Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes to provide more contextualized information. Occupation groups combine data for jobs with similar skillsets, educational attainment, and experience requirements, which provides a more in-depth snapshot of the current labor market when compared to traditional industry data based upon North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. Occupation outlook sections utilize these metrics to identify and display the top in-demand jobs, their entry requirements, and their earning potential.

This report analyzes data from the second quarter of 2018 in the 16-county WIN region and includes summative data for April, May, and June of 2018.



State of the Labor Market in the 16-County WIN Region

Thus far in 2018, the labor force figures decreased in southeast Michigan while employment increased. With this simultaneous drop in labor force and increase in employment, the number of unemployed individuals decreased in the region. This has caused the unemployment rate to drop from the annual rate of 4.5 percent in 2017 to the current year to date (YTD) rate of 4.3 percent as of Q2 2018. Employer demand for most occupation groups also increased during Q2 2018. The customer service occupation group reported the highest demand with over 70,000 job postings during the quarter. Other occupation groups also offer great job opportunities for active job seekers: education postings grew by 27 percent from Q1 2018, and 24 percent of postings were open to entry-level applicants.


Annual Labor Market Information

Moving away from a ten-year high, the labor force in southeast Michigan dropped by 3,154 individuals between 2017 and 2018. Meanwhile, annual average employment increased by 2,342 workers between 2017 and YTD 2018. With employment increasing while the labor force fell, the unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage points from the annual rate of 4.5 percent during 2017 to a current YTD rate of 4.3 percent in the 16-county WIN partnership region.



Quarterly Employer Demand Overview

Data from the second quarter of 2018, including posting information from April, May, and June, indicated strong employer demand throughout southeast Michigan. There were 59,601 more postings during Q2 2018 compared to the 260,461 postings made during Q2 2017 for a total of 320,062 postings. Typically, the first half of the year tends to report lower postings than the second half.





QUARTERLY WORKFORCE INDICATORS

16-County WIN Region | Key Findings for Q2 2018

Employer demand surges to 320,000 postings during Q2 2018, with most occupation groups experiencing increases in online job postings between Q1 and Q2 2018.

During Q2 2018, there were 320,062 postings, 11,304 more postings than the 308,758 during Q1 2018. Most of the occupation groups analyzed by WIN experienced an increase during the second quarter of 2018. The customer service group increased by over 4,000 postings. Online job postings from employers in the education occupation group were up by 27 percent from the previous quarter. This level of posting is the highest since Q3 2017 where there were 320,906 posting made. For more information about quarterly job postings, see page 2.

Soft skills including management abilities and communication are in high demand from employers representing all occupation groups analyzed by WIN.

Of the 320,062 job openings posted during Q2 2018, 27 percent indicated management as a necessary soft skill. Technical skills are a lot more underrepresented in postings, with many postings not listing required skills sets or mentioning skills in the job description. Merchandising was the top technical skill in-demand across postings, with six percent of postings (19,964 postings) mentioning applicants needing this skill. Communication skills were also found in 19 percent of the postings during the quarter, highlighting the importance of soft skills to employers.

Southeast Michigan's unemployment rate is currently at 4.0 percent, down 0.7 percentage points from Q1 2018.

After a decline in labor force and employment numbers during Q1 2018, both figures grew moving into Q2 2018. The greater growth in employment when compared to the growth of labor force participants caused the unemployment rate to drop as more workers found work. 
A Commercial Driver's License (CDL) was the most in-demand certification in Southeast Michigan during Q2 2018.

As a requirement for the top posted occupation, Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, there were over 23,000 postings looking for applicants holding this certification. While most TDL occupation require this certification due to the nature of transportation jobs, many other occupation groups listed CDL as a required or preferred certification.

increased by 22,941 workers (+0.8 percent) between Q1 2018 and Q2 2018. Employment in the 16-county area has also increased from Q1 2018, by 43,614 workers (+ 1.3 percent). With employment increasing more than the labor force, the unemployment rate dropped this quarter: the quarterly unemployment rate decreased by 0.8 percentage points between Q1 2018 and Q2 2018 to 4.0 percent.

Population Demographics


According to the data from the most recent Census Bureau 2016 ACS Five Year estimates, the population in southeast Michigan increased by nearly eight percent between 2015 and 2016. During 2016, 5,718,624 people were living in the region. The sex of the populace was split almost evenly, with about 51 percent of the population identifying as female, and the other 49 percent identifying as male. The majority of the population identified as white (73 percent) with the second largest number of individuals identifying as black or African American (19 percent). The region as a whole is facing an aging population; 28.5 percent of population was over the age of 55, compared to 19.6 percent under the age of 24.

Labor Market Demographics

During 2016, the most recent census year, there were about 2.82 million people in the labor force, meaning they were either working or looking for work, in southeast Michigan. Slightly less than half of the population of 2,071,285 individuals (49.4 percent) living in the region were participating in the labor force. The highest unemployment rates were seen in those aged 24 years old or younger. Males under the age of 19 face an unemployment rate of 27.9 percent. Black or African American job seekers also have a difficult time finding employment, facing an unemployment rate of 18.4 percent.





Current Workforce Demographics

While the Census Bureau data is lagged by about two years, Emsi uses predictive modeling to estimate workforce information for the previous year, allowing for more current analysis. During 2017, there were a total of 2,497,500 individuals working in southeast Michigan. A slight majority (51 percent or 1,277,391 workers) were male, while 49 percent (1,220,110 workers) of the workforce was female. Most of those working in the region were white, accounting for 73.95 percent of the workforce, while African American or black workers accounted for 16.5 percent of the workforce. Those identifying as having a Hispanic or Latino ethnicity accounted for 3.9 percent. Eighty-six percent of the workforce was 25 years or older. Only fourteen percent of those under the age of 25 were working, indicating an aging workforce in southeast Michigan.


Workforce Race and Ethnicity Demographics



Regional Commuting Patterns


According to the most recent OnTheMap data set available from the Census Bureau, during 2015, the region's workforce consisted of 2,295,900 residents. 2,088,193 (91.0 percent) of the residents lived and worked within the 16-county region, while the remaining 207,707 residents (9.0 percent) traveled outside of the region for work. There were 2,269,629 workers employed in the region during 2015. Of those, 181,436 workers (8.0 percent) lived outside of the region's borders and commuted in. From this information, we can see that the southeast Michigan area is a net exporter of jobs, with more workers leaving the area for employment than inwardly commuting.




Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers were the highest in-demand occupation for a second quarter of 2018, with 36,537 online job postings. Of the top five overall in-demand occupations, only Registered Nurses typically requires a bachelor's degree for entry. Median wages for Registered Nurses are nearly \$15 more per hour than the other top jobs. Customer service related occupations round out the remain top five occupations with First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers (10,071 postings), Retail Salespersons (9,176 postings), and Customer Service Representatives (6,344 postings) in high demand during Q2 2018.


These entry-level jobs represent the top posted occupations requiring zero to two years of previous work experience. Many of these occupations (40 percent) require training, some college, or an associate degree. Those who enter the workforce with a bachelor's degree can expect entry wages nearly double those with fewer years of education. Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers were the top posted entry-level job with over 13,000 postings in Q2 2018.


Introduction







Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Technical and Scientific Products were the highest in-demand agriculture occupation during Q2 2018, with 1,102 postings. A similar occupation, Buyers and Purchasing Agents, was the second top posted occupation with 988 postings. Other top posted occupations include Landscaping and Groundskeeping Workers (638 postings), Nonfarm Animal Caretakers (407 postings), and Natural Sciences Managers (407 postings).

Agriculture Wage Overview

Of the top posted agriculture-related jobs, seven of the ten offer median wages of over \$30 per hour according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The top posted job, Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Technical and Scientific Products offer median hourly earnings of \$39.25, which translates to annual earnings of approximately \$68,536.







According to the most recent Emsi data set available (2017), the business and finance occupation group is a relatively diverse occupation group with respect to its over 180,000 workers. Half the working population identify as female (50 percent). In addition, only, 80 percent of workers are white, so the field may offer opportunity for minority workers. Only five percent of the working population is under the age of 25, indicating a large aging population of business and finance workers.



Business Operations Specialists, All Other was the highest in-demand business and finance occupation during Q2 2018, with 4,626 postings. The top posted job from Q1 2018, Accountants and Auditors, remained in high demand with 2,852 postings. Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products (2,832 postings), Marketing Managers (2,832 postings), and Management Analysts (2,239 postings) were all in-demand business and finance occupations during Q2 2018.

Business and Finance Wage Overview

Most business and finance related jobs offer high wages, making for a lucrative opportunity for job seekers willing to attain the necessary education. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), the top posted business and finance job, Business Operations Specialists, All Other, offers median hourly wages of \$32.82, translating to annual earnings of approximately \$68,000.




Introduction










Introduction












































